For Those of You Who Don't Know Who We Are...

Spay and Neuter Solutions was founded as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization on July 1, 2003, to address the issue of unchecked reproduction among companion animals. Pet overpopulation is an issue of great concern to virtually every animal welfare organization, many of which are overwhelmed by the number of homeless or abused pets in our communities.

The goal of Spay and Neuter Solutions is to help make Arizona a pioneer state that can soon claim "no more homeless animals." We are a member of AWASA (Animal Welfare Alliance of Southern Arizona) and work closely with other animal welfare organizations, each of which has its own mission and goals. The sole focus of Spay and Neuter Solutions is in its name: we concentrate all of our efforts on spay and neuter issues.

We **PROVIDE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE** to defray the cost of spaying and neutering for individuals in need, and we **EDUCATE** pet owners about the importance of these procedures in preventing the birth of unwanted animals and in improving the quality of life for their pets.

Right before Christmas, we organized an international bake sale at the Sunflower by Del Webb Community. Spay/Neuter Programs Reduce Unwanted Births

In **March**, we invited the Humane Society of Northern Arizona's Canyon Pet Hospital Mobile Clinic to Tucson. They performed 81 low cost spay/neuter surgeries in a day and a half. Their enthusiasm, fast and very efficient work helped to prevent the birth of hundreds of unwanted cat and dog litters. The event was a collaborative effort between Spay and Neuter Solutions and FAIR (Foundation for Animals In Risk). Financial support was available for qualified pet owners.

Although Spay and Neuter Solutions never planned to participate in animal rescue, we couldn't say no for a plea to save dozens of dogs from Kingman, where an animal facility's kennel license was revoked and more than 100 animals needed to be removed by the end of April.

First, we offered to finance the spay/neuter of unaltered dogs so

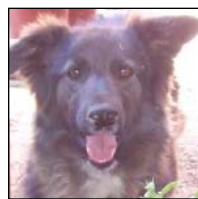
they would have a better chance of being adopted. Cynthia Taylor, founder of The Center for Animal Rescue and

Adoption, arranged for all of the dogs to receive updated rabies vaccinations and vet exams.

Time was crucial in removing these animals from their situation, so when The Center for Animal Rescue and Adoption, who orchestrated a large number of dog rescues from the Kingman facility, asked for physical help, we couldn't say no. We drove up together to Kingman and delivered 10 dogs and puppies to Flagstaff to the Humane Society of Northern Arizona's no-kill shelter. Then we drove back to Kingman and loaded another 8 dogs into our van to bring back to Tucson for adoption.

low-cost spay/neuter days performed by the HSNA's Mobile Spay/Neuter Clinic.

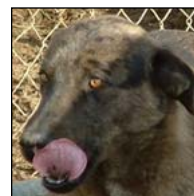
