SPAY AND NEUTER SOLUTIONS TO THE RESCUE Tale of The Reservation Dogs

Spay and Neuter Solutions fields calls daily from people needing help with spaying or neutering their dogs and cats. One such call came from Suzanne Rider, who was on her way home from work on the O'Odham Nation just west of Tucson, and saw two puppies on the side of the road looking for food. She followed them into a yard and out came about 20 big dogs and puppies that looked like they needed food. Suzanne went home to get a water bucket and added a few bags of dog food to the ones she always has in her truck for stray dogs. She fed and watered them for two weeks and knew they needed shots, tick medicine, to be dewormed and spayed and neutered and to go to good homes. Suzanne told us: "I went up to the door where they came from and talked to the lady, and she was willing to let me help. So you know the rest, I was so grateful for your help." Even the original owner's family members on the reservation have "let me take their dogs in to get fixed and shots. It was a gift from the Lord when you guys (Spay and Neuter Solutions) helped me fix them".

Spay and Neuter Solutions paid for most of the surgeries. Some of the dogs were helped by the Sells clinic, which kept five older females and a large wolf mix.

Animals Crusaders, another animal welfare organization, helped with some of the shots. So many good things can happen for the animals when we all work together!

BB was one of those dogs. She was born in the desert on the reservation. She and her sister were the only ones that survived in the litter. At one year old BB didn't know what it was like to have water and food when she needed them and had to resort to digging in garbage and try to find what ever she could to eat and she had to contend with 17 other dogs. She is now living in a home in Tucson with Terri Labrosse. Within 4 days she settled in and became part of Terri's family. BB is enjoying sleeping under the cooler, having a roof over her head to keep the sun off and a soft carpet. It took her a few days to be brave enough to enter the house but once she did it was home sweet home. She follows her new guardian like a little shadow and has quickly learned the rules of the house. BB just wants to please her people and to be loved.

Suzanne wrote to tell us that as of now 10 of the dogs have found new homes! "Thanks again to you guys for all the help, we helped to save a lot of dogs and prevent the birth of many babies. Suzanne"
