We also educate pet owners about the importance of spay/ neuter in preventing the birth of unwanted animals and in improving the quality of life for their pets. ## THE CAT'S OUT OF THE BAG: ANNOUNCING THE PRETTY BOY McTAVISH FUND

Pretty Boy McTavish In the past, our funding sources have limited us to paying only for spay and neuter surgeries. It has always been the goal of SNS to be able to offer **medical assistance** to our clients' pets that is related to spay and neuter or that can be done while the pet is under anesthesia. Funds for post surgery pain medication is not something that our grantors have allo-

cated to SNS and although veterinarians suggest them, pets often go home with nothing to alleviate the pain and discomfort of surgery due to their owners' lack of funds. E-collars that keep pets from licking/biting their stitches are another expense that some of our clients cannot afford and that SNS hasn't been able to pay for. Additional expenses during surgery (which we do pay for) include pets that are pregnant or in heat and male pets for whom just one testicle has descended (crypt orchid) which involves abdominal surgery and is more costly. In addition, many of the pets we serve are rescued from the streets and washes. SNS wants to be able to pay for medications and procedures associated with these situations such as bite wounds, torn paw pads, need for antibiotics, ingrown nails and injuries sustained from car accidents and animal fights.

With our good fortune to be receiving funds from Pima County for spay and neuter, SNS is now raising funds for the expenses that are not covered by our spay/neuter funds. We are calling this fund the **PRETTY BOY McTAVISH** (**PBMcT**) **FUND**, in honor of a feral cat that came into the life of Dot Jones, vice president of SNS. It took 7 months to trap this beautiful tuxedo cat and by the time he was finally captured he had been severely mauled by other cats, had contracted FIV, and had teeth in need of attention and desperately needed antibiotics. PBMcT was lucky that his rescuers were able to afford all the medical help he needed and he lived to be a very pampered member of the family.

At SNS we feel that the more assistance we can provide to our clients, the more inclined they will be to **keep their pets or rescued strays** rather than relinquish them to shelters due to an inability to pay for some basic veterinary care.



This is in line with the philosophy of PAAW (Pima Alliance for Animal Welfare), the organization of which SNS is a participating member.
